- Look at the Daily Folder and review the work each week to check on my child's progress.
- Attend and participate in family programs, Back to School Night and Parent Teacher Conferences to help monitor my child's progress.
- Check the teacher/team Canvas page on a regular basis to keep current about team events.

As a student, I will:

- Arrive at school on time and ready to learn.
- Talk to my family about what I am learning.
- Do my best all day, every day.
- Ask questions at school and home when I don't understand.

Our Goals for Student Achievement

Through high-quality curriculum using the MD College and Career-Ready Standards

English Language Arts -- With support, primary students will accurately read and comprehend literary and informational text. Independently, all students will be able to orally respond to text. By second grade, students will also respond in writing to what they have read. All students will independently write for various purposes using appropriate language, organization and grammar.

Math - Primary mathematics is focused on counting, addition, and subtraction within word problems. By the end of second grade, students will know from memory, sums of two one-digit numbers. Students will learn about and compare hundreds, tens, and ones.
