Talbott Springs Elementary School HOMEWORK GUIDELINES AND INFORMATION

The Howard County Public School System supports students in maintaining and extending their learning. The appropriate design, use and evaluation of homework can be used to inform teachers about student progress and can provide opportunities for independent practice of key skills. TSES Homework Guidelines are based on HCPSS Policy Recommendations.

Grades 1 and 2 teachers will assign homework based on this structure: Students in Grades 1 and 2 should have no more than 20 minutes of homework/night:

^{*}Students will be expected to read and record at least the following number of minutes over the course of a 7-day week (Sunday through Saturday):

Kindergarten and Grade 1= 60 minutes Grade 2 and Grade 3 = 80 minutes Grade 4 and Grade 5 = 100 minutes

Homework (continued):

In grade 1 through grade 5:

Each student will:

- write (glue) homework in the agenda book daily.
- record the number of minutes read each night in the agenda book.
- turn in grade level projects on time.

Teachers will:

- check homework for completion and provide feedback
- assign homework Monday through Thursday.
- use the agenda book to communicate with families about projects, events and school information.

Parents will:

- check and initial the agenda book daily.
- set a time and provide a quiet space for their children to complete their homework.
- provide opportunities for their child(ren) to read to meet the weekly expectation for minutes
- Use the resources provided through Canvas and this document to support their children if there is a question about how to assist at home.

Google Apps for Education	G Suite (Gafe) is used frequently by students in grades 3-5. Students can access their work from any device. Students will need to use their HCPSS student login and password to access their account. As a gentle reminder; this resource is provided by Howard County Public Schools.
