Outdoor Lunch: Some families have asked whether outdoor seating will remain an option for students who wish to eat lunch outside during the colder months. Outdoor lunch will continue to be an option for any student whose parent has selected this option, as the weather allows. Please note that the decision to allow for outdoor lunch is at the discretion of each school administrator, while considering the following criteria: temperature and humidity, wind chill, heat index and air quality, age of students, length of time outdoors, match of a child's clothing for the weather; condition of the eating area, falling precipitation, thunder and lightning, sufficient staffing and supervision.

If your child plans to eat outside, please encourage him or her to dress appropriately for the temperature, including wearing a coat, hat and/or gloves each day. If your child does not own a coat, please contact TSES. Parents or guardians may change their preference of eating location at any time by emailing me at nancy_thompson@hcpss.org.

Inclusive Schools Week: Inclusive Schools Week is an annual event sponsored by the Inclusive Schools Network (ISN) and held each year during the first full week in December. Inclusive Schools Week celebrates the progress that schools have made in providing a supportive and quality education to a diverse student population, including students who are marginalized due to disability, gender, socio-economic status, cultural heritage, language preference, and other factors. At TSES, our Special Education team will highlight the contributions of famous Americans with disabilities each day of the week ahead.

<u>Policy 9050: Student Records</u>: The purpose of this policy is to establish standards and procedures for maintenance of confidentiality, disclosure of information, and security of all

records related to students, in accordance with federal, state, and local laws and regulations. This policy also assures compliance with the Federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) regarding individual student's education records. The Board of Education of Howard County recognizes its responsibility to maintain accurate records related to students, to protect the confidentiality and privacy of all records related to students, and to secure all records related to students except where federal, state, and local laws and regulations provide for disclosure. The Board recognizes the value of parental involvement in all facets of their child's schooling and encourages parents to inspect and review their individual student's education records on a regular basis, especially as their child progresses from one grade level to the next, and toward graduation. The Board also recognizes the right of students and their parents to access their individual student's education records and the right of parents and eligible students to have any specific contents that is determined to be inaccurate or misleading removed from those records.
