**Juneteenth!** Please also take a moment to think about, talk about and celebrate Juneteenth (June 19th) also known as Freedom Day or Emancipation Day as a landmark event in American History. It was on this date in 1865 (two and a half years after the Emancipation Proclamation) that the enslaved Africans were finally freed as word of emancipation reached Galveston, Texas. Learning more about Juneteenth holds important value as we examine our priorities around racial justice and American History. There are many resources available to learn more about Juneteenth including this linked video.

**June 22 and 23, 2020:** It is very important to know that students have the opportunity to complete assignments through June 23, 2020 as that is the official last day of the quarter. If your child has not yet met expectations (below) to 'pass' a class June 22 and June 23 is a great opportunity to make up work that has not yet been completed. I am encouraging students to use this time to access the Canvas modules (Social Studies, Science, Health, Music, Art, Media, Band, Strings, Chorus and Physical Education), the LexiaCore5 minutes and the Dreambox minutes that are not yet completed according to expectations.

- LexiaCore 5=Minimum of 263 minutes to pass
- Dreambox=Minimum of 263 minutes to pass
- Social Studies and Science: minimum of 3 lessons completed to pass
- Health, PE, Music, Art, Media: minimum of 2 lessons completed to pass

Grade level events are planned to celebrate the end of the school year, some of which are planned for June 22 and 23. Information about each of these events will be shared through Canvas email. Please assist your child with checking that information and attending these events.

**Summer Meals~**HCPSS will continue its free meal program for all HCPSS students and anyone under the age of 18 through the summer. Running from July 1-August 14, free meals will be available at locations countywide, weekdays from 11:30-1:30. There will be no meal service Friday, July 3, and weekend meals will be provided at school-based locations Thursday, July 2. Some summer locations differ from the spring locations. Please note that the TSES site will not be available due to construction. Please use the OMMS site.

- 1. Visit www.Schoolpix.com

- 3. It will ask you for a shoot key so you would enter Shoot key: **FV484MEP**

4. Once you have entered that you should be in and just need to fill out all the information for ordering your child's yearbook. There is an issue with entering shipping street information. **Please be sure your billing address is correct as that is where the yearbook will be shipped.**
