Families who register from this time forward will need to complete the HCPSS Training Video and then read and sign the Confidentiality Agreement for Conducting Classroom Visits/Observations and Volunteer Opportunities. The benefit of this new agreement is that there are parameters placed on volunteers, visitors and observers for student safety, privacy and confidentiality.
