NEW INFORMATION:

Parking Lot Safety: The TSES Parking Lot is clearly marked with NO Parking areas. We are asking for the cooperation of every driver during both arrival and dismissal times with honoring the No Parking Zones. Drivers who drive across the marked cross walk zone in our parking lot to park or stand illegally in the NO PARKING zones have compromised the safety of both our staff and our students on several occasions. There is no acceptable reason to violate the parking regulations, especially when safety is compromised. In addition, those violating the clearly marked no parking zones breach the requirements of the Fire Department to keep fire zones clear.

Both now and in the future having initiative to use self-advocacy skills will help children have the power to know how to help themselves solve their problems and reach their goals.

Think what can I do to help myself to reach my goals and solve my problems?

- · Use resources to help me get unstuck.
- \cdot Uses words to express want I want or need.
- · Ask a classmate or adult for help.

Screening for Students at Risk for Reading Difficulties: In accordance with Maryland's Ready to Read Act (2019), all HCPSS kindergarten students will be administered a screener assessment that includes a battery of four one-minute reading measures (DIBELS 8th Edition) to examine their letter naming, decoding, and word reading skills. The assessments will occur throughout winter, 2020. Parents and guardians will be notified if assessment results indicate that your child would benefit from an intervention. This includes kindergarten students who do not have a current Individualized Education

Plan (IEP) or Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP) with reading foundational skills goals. Each student will be assessed for a total of 15 to 20 minutes and that time will be broken up over days.

TSES Wellness Committee has challenged our students each month this school year to try 4 new things in various areas of health and wellness. Join us for our Family Wellness Night on February 27, 2020 as we continue to explore our FOUR IS MORE initiative. During this event, families will rotate through 4 stations: boot camp, mediation/yoga, reducing screen time and karate. The event will end with the kids in the cafeteria having a dance party and a healthy snack, while the parents meet with HCPSS nutritionist in the media center.
